



George Gordon Kissner

November 18, 1938 - November 23, 2021

Lt. Col., George Gordon “Gordy” Kissner, 83, a 24-year USAF veteran, passed away Tuesday, November 23, at home with his loving wife of 61 years and children at his side.

Born in Washington, DC, he was the son of the late Robert and Elizabeth Kissner. He is survived by his wife Nancy, son Robert, daughter Karen (husband John), son Tom (wife Anne); and seven grandchildren: Robert, Christian, Kelly, Sara, Kevin, Katie and Natalie; sister Cathy (husband John), sister-in-law Kara (husband Herbert); two nieces, one nephew, and numerous cousins.

After military service and another decade supporting Department of Defense programs he retired and moved to Salisbury to coach the American Legion Post 145 in 1998 and Post 64 from 1999 to 2010. He supported his players, coaches and families during this time; helping many young men go on to play college baseball. Gordy was elected to the Eastern Shore Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015. Gordy had a passion for baseball, playing collegiately at Gettysburg College, and simply loving most other sports as either a competitive participant or spectator.

He was a lifetime member of the American Legion and VFW. He was an active member of Asbury United Methodist Church where he sang in the choir and played the chiming bells.
